The within last will and testament of Archibault T. Stalins, late of Richmond was presented in court, and William Moseley one of the thereto subscribed, being sworn on the holy evangelists of Almighty God that he was personally present and did see the said testator sign, seal, pronounce and declare the same to be and contain his last will, and that he was of sound disposing mind and memory according to the knowledge and belief, and that he together with Milley Riley subscribed named as witnesses to the same at the request and in the presence of the testator, and in the presence of each other. Whereupon it was ordered to a

In the name of God Amen. I Clearer Drack of the county of State of Georgia, planter, being very sick but of perfect mind and memory, calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament, that is to say: Principally first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hand of Almighty God that give my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent christian burial at the discretion of my executors, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same by the mighty power of God. And as touching such worldly estate wherewith I have been pleased to bless me in this life, I give, devise and dispose of in manner and form as follows: First, I leave to my well beloved wife Esther Drack, negroes, one named Judy, one Dice, one Hilphy, one Will, one Amy, one Violet, one Clareff, together with my plantation messuages and ten all my household furniture, a horse by the name of Doctor, a riding Chariot, cows and calves, four ewes and lambs, two sows and pigs, five two year old. But the two girls Violet and Clareff is to remain in the possession of C. Anderson till the death of my wife, and then all the property that she has at her death, to be divided equally between my two daughters, and at her death to return to their children, also the crops that is in the field. I wish that at the death of my wife that Judy shall be freed.

Also I leave to my well beloved daughter Florencia Anderson, two negroes and Robin, four ewes and lambs, and after her death to return to her children.

Also I leave to my well beloved daughter Rachel Cathoon, two negroes, and Tamy, one mare by the name of Blaze, three two year old hogs, and bread corn for one year, and after her death to return to her children.

Also to my well beloved grand child Sam Triplett, I leave one negro, named Ann, for the money due from me on account of her father's estate.

The remainder of my property to be sold and my debts paid by my executors, all debts due to be collected as quick as possible.

And I do hereby constitute, make and ordain Elijah Anderson and Allen my sole executors of this my last will and testament, and I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke and disannul all and every other former wills, testaments, bequests, legacies, and bequests by me in any way before made.

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and of the same day held in and for the county of Richmond on the 8th day of January 1841, the last will and testament of Charles Brach, late of the County of Richmond, was presented in court, and Jean Triplett, now of the County of Fairfax, thereto submitted, being sworn on the holy evangelists of the Gospel, she made oath that she was personally present and did see the said Charles Brach, last published, promise and declare the same to be and of his last will and testament; that he was of sound disposing mind according to the best of her knowledge and belief, and that she together with the said Anderson submitted their names as witnesses to the same at and in the presence of the said testator and in the presence of each other, upon it was ordered to be recorded.

At the same time Robert Allen, named executor, qualified as such:
