bed clothes, with my other two Daughters Sarah W.
and Mary J. Walker

Third I will that all the rest of my property both real and
personal be equally divided into Seven Shares
of which my Son William shall have one Share
George W. Samra for the Sole and Separate use of
my Daughter Sarah W. Patton, One Share, George
W. Samra in trust for the Sole and Separate use
of my Daughter Mary J. Walker, One Share, the
Daughter of my Son John W. Walker, Living at the time
of my Death One Share, the Daughter of my Son
George W. Walker who may be living at my death, One Share
My Grand Daughter Louisa P. Shepherd, One Share
And my Daughter Anna W. Robinson, for to George W.
Samra for her use, one Share

Fourth I will and desire that in the Devission of my Estate
under the preceding Clause, that the same be so divided
as to allot and award to my Daughter Anna W.
Robinson the house and Lot on which I now reside
on the Land Mills near Stuttgart, and my Son and Girl
Linnal

Fifth The Share or portion given in the third clause of that my
will, to my Son William I give to him, during his
Life only, and at his death I give the same to
my Grand Daughter, Eliza W. Shephard, also the
share to my Daughter, Sarah W. Patton I give to
her Separate use for her Life only, and at her death
