

I, Elizabeth Cornett, of Richmond
County, Georgia, do hereby declare this to be my last will and testament
in writing.

I have no other personal property, except my
clothing, and out of this provide for my
family.

of her faithful services, be manumitted and set free; and that all the rest of my property, namely, Jack, James, Peter, Ned, Miles, young Ben, Shumy, Lecky, Venus, Will, and the future issue of the female part of said negroes, be hired out or worked on rented land, at the discretion of my executors, so long as circumstances may require for carrying my will into compleat effect.

3^{dly} It is my will and desire that my grandson George Cornell Cleveland be educated in the compleatest manner and clothed out of the residue arising from the sale of such of my personal property as above directed to be disposed of, and the yearly profits of my estate.

4^{thly} It is my will and desire that after the necessary appropriation in and out of my said grandson George C. Cleveland, that the residue of the remaining profits of my estate, be paid share and share alike to my dutiful daughter Sarah, wife of Stephen Evans, and Jane, wife of Neil Cleveland, and to the survivor of them during their natural life.

5^{thly} I give devise and bequeath unto my grandson George Cornell Cleveland and to any children which my daughters Sarah and Jane may hereafter be with, and to their heirs and assigns share and share alike, my negro slave in before mentioned, with their future issue and increase; but not to be delivered to them or to either of them until after the death of each of my daughters Sarah and Jane; nor until after my said grand children shall respectively attain the twenty-one years: And provided always and it is my express will and desire that should my grandson George Cornell Cleveland die without leaving lawful issue, and should neither of my daughters have and leave any other child or children, that then and in that case I do revoke the gift or gifts in favor of my said grand children, and do give devise and bequeath the negroes aforesaid with their future issue and increase unto the then surviving children and children of my beloved sister Margaret Dugg, their heirs and assigns, share and share alike.

And lastly. I do appoint my friends William Dugg, Edmund Dugg, and Dr. Rowell, executors of this my last will and testament. hereby revoking all former wills by me at any time before made.

At a court of ordinary held in and for the county of Richmond the 7th day of November 1863.
The foregoing last will and testament of Elizabeth Cornell, deceased was presented in court, and Threewile Win one of the witnesses thereto subscribed, being duly sworn, made oath that he was personally present and did see the said testatrix sign, seal, publish, pronounce and declare the same to be and contain her last will and testament, that she was of sound disposing mind and memory according to the best of his knowledge and belief, and that he together with Robert Johnson subscribed their names as witnesses to the same, at the request, and in the presence of the testatrix and in the presence of each other.
