3<sup>d</sup> I desire that all my just debts be paid and whatever residue may remain after the payment of my debts I give devise and bequeath to be equally divided between my brothers Bathazar Bouyer and Bruno Bouyer and my sister Julie Bouyer widow of Beale, and their heirs and share alike.

4<sup>th</sup> I am indebted to the boy John son of Victoire Josephine before mentioned the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars which I wish my executors to pay to him or expended for his support.

5<sup>th</sup> I nominate Bathazar Bouyer & Paul Reforgnot de Salin the Executors of this my last will & Testament.
