First, I desire to be buried in a plain unostentatious manner, and if a plain stone be placed at the head of my grave, with on either inscription upon it, show my name the time and place of my birth, the time & place of my death and the following from the lips of the patriarch Jacob "I have waited for thy salvation O Lord."

Secondly, I give to my daughter Rebecca Comfort five thousand five hundred dollars.

Third, I desire my executors to appropriate two thousand dollars to the payment of the debts due at the date of this will, by my son William Loringstreet to John P King, James Carter's estate, Gilbert Loringstreet & Augustus B Loringstreet, to be divided among them according to the amounts of their demands, (computing the principal sum alone); but upon this condition, that each of said creditors receiving their respective dividends do give to my said son William a full and entire release & discharge from all further liability to them in account of said debts. Should there be a balance of the two thousand dollars left after paying said creditors the principal of the debts aforesaid, I give that balance to the said William.

Fourth, I desire that any negro woman ~~Leah~~ be sold to a Master
Mistress of her own choosing, provided one can be found who will
give for her within twenty five per cent of what any ~~white~~ ^{white} person may
think her fair value.

My interest in the lands conveyed by David Wellhouse to
late husband, commencing with the first water lands, I give to my
children Rebecca, Gilbert, Augustus & William in equal proportions
Heath. All the rest of my real estate I give to be conveyed into
as also all my personal property and business specifically bequeathed
in order to meet the provisions hereinafter specified.

To Norman Wallace, Esquire, of Savannah, I give and bequeath
the sum of Ten thousand Dollars in trust to him for the use of the
two surviving Daughters of Anne C. Whaley, Daughter of Peter Ed-
wards, deceased, late of New Providence, that is to say, one thousand
Dollars for the use of each of said surviving Daughters (or grand
daughters).

To the said Norman Wallace I give and bequeath the further
sum of Ten thousand Dollars in trust to him for the use of Mary C.
Edwards Daughter of the said Peter Edwards deceased.

I give and bequeath unto John Edwards, son of the
