I Mary W. Oakman of Barnwell District, in the State of South Carolina, being sick and weak in body but of sound and disposing mind, memory and understanding, praised be God for the same, do make and declare this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following (that is to say)

First. I give and devise my Lot of Land in the village of Barnwell, wherein I now reside, together with all the Houses and other improvements thereon: also three unimproved Lots of Land in the said village containing each one acre known and designated in the plat or plan of the said village as No 18. No 19. No 20: also the plantation or tract of land wherein I now plant, containing eight hundred acres situate in the District of Barnwell on the drains of Toby's creek adjoining lands of Barnwell & Brown, Ambrose W. O'Bannon and others: and also that tract of land being in the District aforesaid containing seventy three acres adjoining the tract last above mentioned and land lately Brasell's and land granted to Elizabeth Harrison, unto my daughter Mary Ann Oakman her heirs and assigns forever.

Item. I give and bequeath the following Negro slaves namely Jane and her two children Rose and Pinks, Mimi, Anaka, her child Claripa, together with the increase of the females; also my silver headbasket, and all my silver ware marked with the initials, M. A. O. unto my said Daughter her Executors, Administrators and assigns.

Item. I give and devise four lots of land in the village aforesaid containing each one acre and known and designated on the plan or plat of the village as No 9. No 12. No 13. and No 27. together with all the improvements thereon: also all that plantation or tract of land containing two hundred acres situate in the District aforesaid, near the Court House, purchased by me from Julius M. Robison, bounded by lands of John Rickabaker, Lewis O'Bannon, Joseph Duncan and John I. Thompson, unto my son William Henry Oakman, his heirs and assigns forever.

Item. I give and bequeath the following Negro Slaves namely Jane and her three children Affy, Charles, and Mary, Mimi, London, and

...of the fruits: and
 my wife, children and the Trustees, H. A. O., unto my
 executors, administrators and assigns. My will is, that
 executors of this my last Will and Testament, do, at their own
 will all the rest and residue of my Estate, real and personal, and
 whosoever of what nature, kind and quality the same may be or
 not have been given and disposed of, and the proceeds of such sale
 or sales (after the payment of my debts and funeral expenses), I give
 and bequeath to my said children equally share and share alike.
 And I hereby commit the Guardianship of my said children, until they
 shall respectively attain the age of twenty one years, unto the Trustees
 of this my last Will and Testament. And I do hereby constitute
 and appoint my friends Jennings O. Bannow and John Rickbanks
 and my Brother William Henry Oakman Executors of this my
 Last Will and Testament.

 Henry W. Oakman as and for his Last Will and Testament in
