I Howell R. Marshall, being weak in body, but of sound and disposing mind, Do make this my last Will and Testament in manner following -

Item In the first place - It is my wish and desire, after my death, to be buried in a decent and Christian-like manner and without any unnecessary show. I wish and desire my just debts to be paid as soon as possible after my death, by my Executors herein after mentioned.

Item I give and bequeath unto George A. B. Walters the sum of two thousand dollars - and it is my particular desire and I hereby enjoin it upon him, to appropriate so much of the said sum as will be sufficient to purchase, at the sale of the negroes belonging to the Estate of my deceased Uncle Edward Powell, the following negroes - to wit: Old Jack and his daughter Molly and her great grand daughter Gilly - and that he exercise a protecting care over said negroes - securing and allowing them the full measure of liberty and free agency, which can be enjoyed under the Laws of Georgia.

Item I give and bequeath unto each of my Executors herein after mentioned the sum of five hundred dollars.

Item I give devise and bequeath all the rest and residue of my Estate of every kind, nature and description whatsoever to my Sisters Elizabeth Sibley, Mary Ann Westbrooke, and Rebecca Jackson and their heirs - to be divided into three equal parts - Shares and Shares alike.

Item I hereby nominate and appoint George L. Turggs, and Valentine Walter Executors of this my last Will and Testament, and authorize and empower them to act as they think best for the interest of my Estate without being under the direction or control of the Court of Ordinary.
