I Hugh Mages of the County of Richmond and State of Georgia being of sound and disposing mind and memory do make and constitute my last Will and Testament in manner following that is to say, I give my soul to God who gave it, my body I recommend to God in a Christian like manner,

I give and bequeath to My beloved Wife Mary Mages Three Hundred and fifty Acres of Land, to be run off the tract of land of the County of Richmond, beginning at the West side of My Mill Pond and running of it from said Pond, thence out in the form of a parallelogram to the land where some site near to which are two springs which are to be included in the said Three Hundred and fifty Acres for and during the term of her natural life, and on the demise of my said Wife Mary Mages the said Three Hundred and fifty Acres of Pine Land divided as above to be divided between My said Mary Mages and his heirs forever, I also give and bequeath to My Wife Mary My Negro Girl Molly for and during the term of her natural life, and on the demise of my said Wife Mary Mages to be divided equally with her issue and increase and to be divided between her heirs forever, I also give and bequeath to My said Mary Mages My Kitchen furniture and My riding horse and My black and white Mares ten head of Cattle and My plantation of pears and apples and My plantation of

last Will and Testament, hereby reciting all things and being  
George Allen Guardians of the said William Mague, last of the County of  
of Tisbury and of Peace, and Myself his last Will and Testament

My seal this twenty eight day of September in the year of our Lord  
Eighteen hundred and twelve.

and declare the same to be and contain his last Will and Testament

Witnesses to the same at the request and in the presence of the  
testator and in the presence of each other. Whereupon the same  
was ordered to be recorded.
