of Sweet Creek. Containing One hundred & fifty acres parcel
of Daniel Morris. Also Fifty Acres at Cobblington to be held
at her discretion, so as to include the spring and situation of
the same, together with the interest claim and demand to be had
of the said land devised to me by the Will of Daniel Neal
the said Daniel Morris gave to my Wife, Polly, Peter Dave, William
John, John Hinch, Benjamin and Lucretia together with
the family of the said Slaves as may exist at the time
of my death and otherwise lawfully begotten, also all the
rest of my Estate I bequeath unto my dear friend
