one year during the balance of her life to be paid to her quarterly or more
often in such manner as may best suit the convenience of my Executors
as her wishes. I also give and bequeath unto my dearly beloved sister
Anna one hundred dollars per year during her natural life, to be
paid to her at least quarterly by my Executors. The balance of my E-
state and effects whatever they may be, I give and bequeath unto my
dearly beloved wife to be used and expended at her own discretion and
to be divided away at her death as she may think best, relying as I
do on her discretion & the affection for her children by me. The bequest to
my Mother and sister after their death to revert to my wife as a portion
of the residue of the Estate. I desire to be plainly shrouded & buried at the
land Hills next to my daughter Eleanor Sumner. If it be necessary under
this instrument that a Guardian should be appointed to my chil-
dren of which I am at this moment doubtful I hereby appoint my
dearly beloved wife the said Guardian, knowing as she does my mind
as regards the rearing of children. I do hereby nominate and appoint
my dearly beloved wife Executrix and my brothers Abraham and
Isaac Moore and my brother in Law John S. Cohen Executors
to carry into effect this my last will and Testament. In
testimony hereof I hereby set my hand and seal this twenty one
with day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and thirty seven.

that the legacy bequeathed to Mr. Mary Loring be paid to John Camp-
bell in Trust for his children the receiving the profits of said legacy
during his life and at his decease to be equally divided among
the said children.

Secondly, I give and bequeath to James Westpatrick five hundred
dollars.

Thirdly, I give and bequeath the residue of my estate real and per-
sonal to my brothers John and Daniel Westpatrick, for the purpose
of extinguishing all debts against me and the residue of my estate
to be received by my said brothers John & Daniel share and share
alike as their several legacies.

I do hereby constitute and appoint my said brothers John & Daniel
Westpatrick executors to this my last will and Testament, and con-
stitute and appoint them Testamentary Guardians of the minor
legacies above named and do hereby revoke all other wills by me
made.
