In the name of God, Amen, I, James Harris of
the state and county aforesaid, being in a low state of health, but of sound, disposing
mind and memory, do make this my last will and testament, in manner and
form following, viz:

Imprimis. It is my will, that my beloved wife Salotha Harris shall, during
her natural life, have the full use and occupancy of all my land and plantations, and
the following negroes, James, Simon, Emanuel, John, Charles, Peter, Fanny and
Sarah; and at her decease, the same shall be equally divided between my three sons,
Michael, Walter and Jeremiah, share and share alike, except as hereafter mentioned.

Secondly. It is my will, that my beloved sister Mary Anderson shall, during
her life, have a decent and comfortable maintenance from the profits of the land and
negroes above mentioned. And that in case either of my daughters, Mary
shall remain unmarried at the death of their mother, that they shall have
the use of such a proportion of my lands as will be necessary for their support.

Thirdly. It is my will, that the wife, son and daughter of my son
hereinafter mentioned, and that all the property of my son, shall be
changed, that the residue shall be appropriated to the support of my wife.

My last will and testament, I give and bequeath to my daughter Rachel Harris, five negroes, as follows, to wit: one named Robert, together with the sum of fifty dollars, also the sum of five dollars to be paid for out of the money arising from the sale of the crop before mentioned.
