I James D. Hurst of the County of Richmond and State
of Georgia being weak in body, but of sound and disposing mind
do make this my Last will and Testament in manner following
In the first place. I desire to be buried in a decent manner

as my Executor hereafter named may think best.

Item. It is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid as soon as possible after my decease - and for this purpose should the profits of my Estate not be sufficient to meet the demands of my creditors, my said Executor is hereby authorized and empowered to sell such property as he may think best, without the formality of obtaining an order of Court for that purpose, and whatever my said Executor shall see fit to sell and dispose of, he is hereby authorized to make, execute and deliver bills for.

Item. I give, devise and bequeath unto my wife Susannah all my household & kitchen furniture, for and during the term of her natural life, and at her death it is my will and desire that the same be divided among my children, who may be living at the time, equally, share and share alike.

Item. I give, devise and bequeath all my other Estate of every kind and description whatever to be equally divided and distributed, share and share alike, among my wife Susannah and my children Sarah Jane, Francis Eliza, Mary Margaret Ann Elizabeth and James, including the child or children with which my wife Susannah is now pregnant, should it or they be born. - my wife Susannah to have her portion for and during the term of her natural life - and at her death the same to be equally divided, share and share alike among all my children who may be alive at the time of her death, and to the heir or heirs of such as may have died providing thereto. - (such heir or heirs I desire to represent and take the share their parent, if

life, would have receiving. I make the distribution share of my children I desire to go to them and their heirs forever.

Lastly - I constitute and appoint Valentine Belcher sole Executor of this my Last Will & Testament.

In Testimony whereof, I have, to this my Last Will and Testament (hereby revoking all other wills and Testaments) set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty eighth day of May in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine.
