head second. I give and bequeath unto my Grand children John &
John Alfred & Holly Devide & Holly Clara N. Holt & Lenny I
Holly the children of my daughter Harriet N. Holt the following
named Eleven negro slaves viz. George & his wife Mary & their chil-
dren Moses, Jack, Henry, Polly & Sally; also Betty & her two sons
Quay & Robert; also Lenny together with their future issue in-
cluded, all which negroes I desire shall remain in the possession of
my Daughter Harriet N. Holt for the use of herself and my said
Grand children until the youngest of them shall be of age, and then
the said negro slaves that may be alive with their future issue must
be divided equally among my before mentioned Grand children the
children of my daughter Harriet N. Holt that may be then alive
thou & share alike.

Item third, I give & bequeath to my Grand children James Sam-
uel Toole, Harriet Mary Toole, William Toole, John Toole & Susannah
Toole the children of my son George W Toole, Eight negro slaves &
their future increase as follows: Tom & his wife Nancy & their chil-
dren Lucy, Charlotte, Cesar, Marbury, Patsy & Lenny which negroes I
desire & wish to be kept together or hired out as circumstances may
require for the use of my said Grand children the children of my
son George W. till the youngest of them shall come of age & then the
said negroes that may be alive together with their future issue
must be divided among my last named Grand children equally
share & share alike. I also give & bequeath to my son George
W Toole my Lot of Land containing four hundred & ninety acres
known as number forty two (42) in the seventh (7th) District
of Irwin County in the State of Georgia.

Item fourth, I give & bequeath to Mr. Susannah Cunningham
my Girl Sarah.

Item fifth, I give & bequeath to Eliza Murree my Girl
Amy.

Item sixth I give & bequeath to my wife Susannah the follow-
ing property viz. old Jack, Morda, Ned, Dublin, Jacob, Henry, Nelly
her children Betty, Andy & Melly, also old Noddy, Maria & her children
Ida, Delia & Henry. Also my House & Plantation called Mount Eden
together with all my furniture of every sort, also my carriage, my
Horses together with all my cattle & the stock & plantation tools
and all other property not heretofore disposed of which I may be
posseessed or to which I may have any right at the time of my
death to do with & disposed of as she may think proper.

I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Susannah Toole
my Executrix to this my last will only will & Testament, inuring
requiring of her to perform my desires accordingly and to oblige

Richmond County & I Britton Mims of the State and County aforesaid being male and full of body, but of a sound and disposing mind. Do make this my last will and Testament, in manner and form following.
