Richmond County } In the name of God, Amen, I John Fox, of Marchmont in the County and State aforesaid, being male and of legal age, but of sound and disposing mind and memory, and desiring to dispose of my worldly affairs, do make order and publish this writing as my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and annulling all others heretofore made by me, and do declare my Will to be as follows: viz:

It is my wish that my Executors, herein after named, do pay all my just debts, as soon as possible after my decease.

To my niece Mrs. Catherine Beale, wife of Charles T. Beale of Columbia County (having already liberally provided for her family) I give and bequeath the sum of one thousand Dollars.

I give and bequeath unto Mr. Charlotte McGehee wife of John McGehee of Florida, the sum of one thousand Dollars.

I give and bequeath unto Albert Degier, Brother of the said Charlotte McGehee, the sum of one thousand Dollars.

I give and bequeath unto Rebecca Degier Sister of the said Albert Degier, the sum of one thousand Dollars.

To Norman Wallace, Esquire, of Savannah, I give and bequeath the sum of Two thousand Dollars, in trust to him for the use of the two surviving Daughters of Anne E. Edwards, Daughter of Peter Edwards, deceased, late of New Brunswick, that is to say, one thousand Dollars for the use of each of said surviving Daughters (or grand daughters.)

To the said Norman Wallace I give and bequeath the further sum of Two thousand Dollars in trust to him for the use of Lydia Edwards Daughter of the said Peter Edwards deceased.

I give and bequeath unto Peter Fox Edwards, son of the said Peter Edwards, deceased, the sum of Three thousand Dollars.

I give and bequeath unto John Fox Edwards, son of the said Peter Edwards, deceased, the sum of Five thousand Dollars.

It is my Will and I hereby declare that my Executors here named are friends of Mr. Wallace and of my family and I hereby declare that I have not been afflicted by any mental or physical infirmity at the time of the making of this Will.

Principal Church in the City of Augusta, Georgia, the sum of Two thousand Dollars.
I give and bequeath the sum of Two thousand Dollars to the Presbyterian Church of the City of Augusta, Georgia, the sum of Two thousand Dollars.
I give and bequeath the sum of Two thousand Dollars to the Episcopal Church in the City of Augusta, Georgia, the sum of Two thousand Dollars.
I give and bequeath the sum of Two thousand Dollars to the City of Augusta the sum of Two thousand Dollars.

To James Henry Sproun, of Edgefield District, South Carolina, I give and bequeath the sum of Two thousand Dollars, in trust that he will put the same under contract on good security or invest in some profitable stock and pay over the interest or dividends arising from the same to Dr. James Sproun, of said District, during his natural life, and further that in case of the death of the said Dr. Sproun, in the life time of his present wife, he will pay over the said interest or dividends to his said surviving wife, during her natural life. And upon the further trust that upon the decease of the said Dr. James Sproun, if he should outlive his said wife, or in case he should be the survivor then immediately after her death, he will pay over and transfer the same to my Executors herein after named to be disposed of under the several provisions herein after contained relative to the residue of my Estate. Provided, nevertheless, and such is the express condition of the above bequest that the said Dr. James Sproun shall not present any claim against my estate for professional services rendered to me or any of my people in my life time, or on any other account whatsoever; the above bequest being intended to operate as a final settlement of all accounts between us.

To my friend Antoinette Paquet of Augusta, for his attention to my business for more than two years, I give and bequeath the sum of Two thousand Dollars to be considered as in full satisfaction for his said services.

To Amey Tubby, of Augusta, Georgia, I give and bequeath the sum of Two thousand Dollars in trust to and for the use of Augustus Tubby, my adopted son of Amey Tubby of Augusta. The interest thereof to be applied as far as required to the education and support of the said Augustus during his minority and until he attains the age of twenty five years upon his attaining which age the said principal sum of Two thousand Dollars and any accumulated interest which may then be in the hands of the said trustee to be paid over to him the said Augustus. And upon the further trust that the said Amey Tubby will in case of the death of the said Augustus before he turns of the said age of twenty five years, pay over the said sum of Two thousand Dollars and any accumulated interest of this Will or the same or other disposed of under the provisions of my said Will to the residue of my Estate. Antoinette Paquet and Amey Tubby being the mother of the said Augustus.

to me and the children of my wife, and I have permitted to my wife and children to use the same under the existing laws of the State of Georgia, and that the gift of the same to me and the treatment of them according to my wishes herein before expressed may not become burdensome to the said Legacies. I hereby give and bequeath unto them, the said Benjamin, Antoine, Reginald, and Henry H. Cummings, and the widows and survivors of them, fifty shares of the Capital Stock of the Bank of Augusta to be used by them according to their discretion, in carrying into effect my said wishes in relation to the said Legacies, so far forth as may be compatible with the Laws of the State of Georgia:-

I give and bequeath unto John Fox Brochon, son of M. W. Brochon of Augusta the sum of One Hundred Dollars:-

It is my will that my Executors do not require from Mr. Brochon of Augusta, widow of the late Joseph Brochon, payment of any part of the rent-charge now or hereafter due by her, at the time of my decease, for the use and occupation of the tenement in which she now lives:-

I give and bequeath unto the Successors of the Augusta Tract Society, and to his Successors in office the sum of Five hundred Dollars for the sole use and benefit of the said Society:-

It is my Will and desire that my Executors proceed to erect and complete all improvements either contracted for or in progress in my several lots in the City of Augusta; contracts for which have been made for me by M. Antoine Reginald, who is fully acquainted with their circumstances, and is requested to superintend the execution of them:-

To enable my Executors more conveniently to carry into effect the several provisions of this my last Will and Testament, herein before contained; it is my wish and desire and I hereby order and direct that, all my Estate, of what kind soever, not herein specifically bequeathed or devised, be sold, by my Executors, so soon after my decease as they may deem expedient, in such manner (not less than ten days) and at such times and places, and upon such terms, as they may deem best for the interests of my ^{last} Estate:-

It is further my will and desire that, after the payment of my just debts and the Legacies herein before mentioned, the residue of the proceeds of my Estate be divided into five equal parts, of which I dispose as follows, viz: I give and bequeath one fifth part of said residue to the Treasurer of the American Bible Society and to his Successors in office, for the sole use, benefit and behoof of the said American Bible Society:-

but of sound mind and disposing memory, and anxious
the uncertainty of life at all times, do make and ordain this my
