In the name of God Amen. I Thomas Thompson do
present of sound and disposing mind and perfecting health and reflecting on
uncertainty of human life. Do make and publish this my last will
& testament hereby revoking all former wills and testaments.
In witness whereof, I will and bequeath to each of my married & unmarried children
one hundred Dollars and to my sister Susan Thompson I bequeath one hundred
Dollars.

I give and devise unto my Brother Thomas Thompson one hundred and
fifty Dollars and to my mother one hundred & fifty Dollars.

I give and bequeath to my niece Mary Agnes Thompson daughter of my
brother John Thompson & Nancy his wife five hundred Dollars.

I will and bequeath to Alexander John Thompson son of the late Miss
Susan Thompson four thousand Dollars and it is my will
and desire that he should be immediately taken from his mother and placed
under the direction of my Executor hereafter named and that he be
educated.

I give and devise to my brother John Thompson all my wearing apparel

I will and bequeath to my Executor hereafter named sum of money
to purchase a white boy about twenty one years of age, and
a young woman named Cherry, both the property of Benjamin Thompson
and purchased to give him his freedom and serve as servants to him.

It is my will and desire that the money bequeathed to my brother
Alexander shall be under the immediate control of my Executor and he
shall invest in such proportions and at such times as they may think
proper and not to be made subject to any debts by him hereafter
