In the name of God, amen, I John F. Greenwood of the State and
County aforesaid being sickly and weak in body, yet thank God of sound
disposing mind and memory, and knowing that it is appointed unto
men once to die do make and order this my last Will and Testament,
and first of all, I recommend my soul into the hands of God who giv-
eth, and my body to the earth from whence it was originally taken, to be
buried decently, by my Executors, nothing doubting but I shall receive the
same again in the resurrection of the last day - and as to such worldly
goods wherewith it hath pleased Almighty God to bless me in this life, I
give and dispose of them in the following manner and first I wish are my
just debts (which are not many nor large) to be paid.

1st I give unto my brother Robert S. Greenwood my silver watch, also my saddle
called Black Prince, also a small negro boy Jim about twelve years old.

2nd I give to my niece Sarah J. Porter, my somewhat new years old mare
Spring called Liberty, also all my ready money except Two hundred dol-
lars.

3rd I give to my brother Henry Greenwood my sorrow and blade, ex-
cepting the cut ^{with} which she is now in fold, also my big smooth bore gun
known by the name of the Broadtop gun, the gun to be kept by my
son Robert until he is married at the age of eighteen years old.

4th I give to my brother Edmund S. Greenwood, the coat above named
the same as above.

5th My will is that my son John F. Greenwood be left
to the care of my brother Robert S. Greenwood, and his wife Sarah F. Greenwood, and
that the same be paid from the sale to be given to

...the hundred dollars ...
...in pulling the moon ...

...to sell or dispose of the same ...
...his body, ordain, constitute and appointing any trusty and well beloved ...
...the said John T. Greenwood the sole Executor of his my last will and Testament ...
