Will of George Greenwood, Montgomery County.

In the name of God, amen, I John T. Greenwood of the State and
County aforesaid being sickly and weak in body, yet thank God of some
disposing mind and memory, and knowing that it is appointed unto
men once to die, do make and ordain this my last, will and testament
and first of all, I commend my soul into the hands of God who gave
it, and any body to the earth from whence it was originally taken, to be
buried decently, by my executors, nothing doubting but I shall receive the
same again in the resurrection of the last day - and as to such worldly
goods wherewithal it hath pleased Almighty God to bless me in this life, I
give and dispose of them in the following manner and first, I wish all my
just debts which are not many no large to be paid.

2^d I give unto my brother Robert T. Greenwood my silver watch, also my Jack
knife called Black Prince, also a small negro boy Jim about twelve years old
3^d I give to my niece Sarah T. Porter, my son's wife three years old most
spring called Shirley, also all my ready money except two hundred dollars.

4^d I give to my brother Henry Greenwood my sorrow mare black ex-
cepting her colts which she now in fold, also my big smooth bore gun
known by the name of the Broadbills gun, this gun to be kept by my
son Robert until Henry comes to the age of eighteen years old.

5^d I give to my brother Benjamin T. Greenwood, the bolt above reserved
to him alone.

6^d My will is that my son's wife and her bolt John Donistoff be re-
tained after my death and the same to be sold and the money arising from the sale to be given to
