In the name of God Amen, I John Liverman of the County of Augusta in the State of Georgia, being of sound mind and disposing memory, make this my last will and Testament as follows:

First - It is my will that my just debts be paid.

Second - It is my will and desire that what money I have on hand at the time of my death, as well what may be received after my death from debts owing my estate, may be appropriated to the purchase of such property as may be by my Executors considered most advantageous to the Interest of my Estate; and that my whole Estate remain undivided and in the hands and under the control of my Executors until the youngest child living arrives at the age of fourteen years, for the maintenance and support of my aged and infirm Father and my wife, and the maintenance, support and education of my younger Children until they respectively arrive at the age of fourteen years, as aforesaid, then it is my will, that a division of such my Estate and remainings at that time take place between my wife and Children share and share alike, except my negro boy Francis which I give to my daughter Martha independent of her equal share with the others, with the understanding that she has a share of my said estate which is to go to my daughter Sarah Ann the wife of John S. Lot, I give and bequeath to my Executors in trust for the use of her and the Children independent of any claim that now exists or that may hereafter exist against her husband the said John S. Lot, and with the further understanding that my Father is to be still supported should he then be living.

I hereby nominate constitute and appoint my wife Elizabeth Executor and my son in Law Daniel S. Roman Executor of this my last will and Testament.
