One fourth part of all my estate, both real and personal, to be paid to my son, William Burney, for his use and enjoyment, during his natural life, and after his death, the same to be paid to my children, in equal shares, for ever. One fourth part of all my estate, both real and personal, to be paid to my daughter, Mary Savage, for her use and enjoyment, during her natural life, and after her death, the same to be paid to my children, in equal shares, for ever. One fourth part of all my estate, both real and personal, to be paid to my daughter, Sarah Savage, for her use and enjoyment, during her natural life, and after her death, the same to be paid to my children, in equal shares, for ever. My will and desire is that if my daughter, Mary Savage, should die before she comes to the age of twenty one or should leave her share of my estate to be the property of any other person, then my will and desire is that my wife, Elizabeth Savage, should have her share of land where I now live. My desire is that my children should have their share of my estate when they come of age or marry. I nominate and appoint my wife, Elizabeth Savage, and my son, Daniel, sole Executors of this my last will and testament. In all things hereunto I have set my hand and annexed my seal this fourteenth day of December one thousand eight hundred and ten.
