That I give and bequeath to my honored and beloved Father Joseph Waller now or lately of Ballygallow in the Parish of Ballygallow within the County of Colerain in that part of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland the sum of Two thousand Dollars lawful money of the United States of America, and in case my said Father should dies or depart before he receives me, then it is my will and desire that this money should become part of the residue of my Estate, but that the same should be equally divided among my said Sisters Jane, Mary, Elizabeth, Martha and Betty if alive at the time of my decease, or if any of them should be dead, then among the survivors of them and their lawful heirs if any be deceased, the heirs of each of the deceased Sisters standing in the place of the said Sister and letting her portion.

I give and bequeath to each of said daughters a small lot of land in the Parish of Ballygallow within the County of Colerain in that part of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland the sum of Two thousand Dollars to be paid to each of them by my Executors within three months after my decease, and if any of them should be dead, then among the survivors of them and their lawful heirs if any be deceased, the heirs of each of the deceased Sisters standing in the place of the said Sister and letting her portion.
