Estate both Real and personal, for and during her natural life
and upon the death of my said Wife Martha Crook, my estate
(Personal) is and I do will bequeath and devise all my said
Estate both Real and Personal and in which I have reserved
life Estate to my Wife Martha) unto my beloved Grand Children
Jonathan Lyon, John Lyon, Patrick Lyon, and James Lyon
and their heirs for ever equally to be divided among them,
they and share alike, and lastly I nominate and appoint my
only friend Lewis Collins exquire Executor to this my last
Will and Testament this 10th day of September in the year of
1818 one thousand eight hundred & 18
