testimony make this to be my last will and testament

I give and bequeath to all the remainder of my Property to her and her

until the event of her getting married or dying, it is my will that
my Executors immediately thereafter to be persons of full age, Color
and Moral and Personal as aforesaid and to pay the proceeds thereof to the
use and support of all my Children who are now living and unmarried
and the survivors and survivors of them until they arrive at the age of twenty
years or get married, after which time it is my will and desire that the
Property of every description shall be divided between all my Children
and share alike except my Daughter Eliza the Wife of Richard Weeks
who is to receive only five Dollars, unless my said Wife should die
before and unmarried, but in that event it is my will and desire that
my Property shall be divided share and share alike between the survivors
and that may be in life at the marriage or death of my said Wife
except my said Daughter Eliza the Wife of Richard Weeks who
is to receive five Dollars as aforesaid,

I hereby nominate constitute and appoint Joseph W. C. and John M. W.
of the County of Augusta Executors of this my last will and testament.
