I Eliza Arnold being of sound mind and memory, sensible of the uncertainty of life - do make, ordain and publish this to be my last Will and Testament, -

First - I will and request that as soon as convenient after my decease, all my just demands against me be paid, and all expenses attending my funeral.

Item - I give and bequeath to Elizabeth Seaborn Jones one hundred dollars in cash - to be put out to interest until she is of age; and then principal & interest to be paid to her. Likewise a pair of buckles and pins, and silk bod quilt to be delivered to her immediately. -

Item - I give and bequeath to Melvina S. M. P. one soup ladle, one dozen of table spoons and half doz of desert, and half doz tea spoons, her life time, and to go to her Eldest Daughter, if she have one, - if not, she may dispose of them as she thinks proper. -

Item - I give and bequeath to Mrs Ann M. Walker all my house and kitchen furniture and one cow - and as my wearing apparel, I leave with Mr & Mrs Jones & Ann Walker, to divide amongst them as they think proper. -

Lastly - I give and bequeath to Virginia, L. B. Walker and to Anna M. Jones and to Abraham C. Walker and Robert W. Bess, to these four I wish all the Residue of my Estate real and personal to be equally divided between them when they come of age. And do hereby appoint Jonathan S. Bess my Executor and Elizabeth Jones my Co-executor, to carry into effect this my Will and Testament. In witness whereof I hereunto set my hand this fourth day of June

And secondly - Robert Walker Bass having been removed by death, I desire that the portion bequeathed to him be given to his brother, Oliver, and in case any of the children, to whom I have left legacies, should depart this life before my death, I desire, that the part bequeathed to such child, be divided between the surviving brothers and Sisters, or surviving brother and sister of such deceased legatee. -

I give and bequeath my cow to Ann M. Walker.
