Circumstances having made some change in my intentions as to the disposition of my property in the foregoing testament, I desire that the following be considered a part of my last Will and Testament and I hereby declare it as such by way of Codicil. - That is to say, in my Will and desire, that in case of the decease of Eliza Seaborn Bond, whom I have made a Legatee, whatever I have bequeathed to her shall go to her mother Elizabeth Seid.

And secondly - Robert Walter Bond having been removed by death, I desire that the portion bequeathed to him be given to his brother Oliver, and in case any of the Children, to whom I have left bequest, should depart this life before my death, I desire, that the part bequeathed to such child, be divided between the surviving brothers and Sisters, or surviving brother and sister of such deceased legatee.
