undersigned Louisa Susan Victoria Magman born in the Parish of St. Andrew
in the part of the Island of St. Domingo call'd Antiboite, now within

in perfect health do hereby declare that the following dispositions, and
wishes, I declare that I am married to Mr. Dr. Batte Magman

during our Marriage we have had one son and five Daughters, all
belonging to Mr. Dr. Batte Magman, my husband

I bequeath to Mr. Dr. Batte Magman, my husband
and to come, with the exception of six slaves
namely a female Woman Sally, a Negro Woman and
a Negro Man, named, Gertrude, Michael and Lewis. I give
to the said six slaves to have full possession, during his life time
and after his death the said six slaves as well as all their children
and grandchildren to be forever free.

...and if any before the said Justice by the said Justice
...it is ordered that the same be put
...to be admitted to record.

Indies and to hold said property during her natural life.

Second I give and bequeath after the death of My Wife all the property
and estate or that may exist at her decease to My Daughter Mary
Blanchette unto her to have & dispose of said property as she will
I give unto her the privilege of selling if agreeable, therefore
I give property to her property.

And wishing that my said Daughter should marry and that she
be a Christian then it is my wish and will that what of my property
she the possessor of at her death may be shared between her
and three of my late son John Julien, which died in Carolina and
Louis Poisson, Louis Poisson and John Julien Poisson my nephews
in North Carolina.

I have written all other wills that I may have made.
