I give and bequeath unto John Bond and Paul Subersimory, their heirs and assigns, All that lot of land on the south side of Broad Street in the City of Augusta, bounded on the north by Broad Street, South by Ellis Street, East by a lot improved by a large brick house, belonging to my son George White, To have and to hold the said lot and all improvements thereon unto the said John and Paul, their heirs and assigns In Trust Nevertheless and to and for the following uses, intents and purposes, that is to say, In trust for the sole and separate use, benefit, advantage and behoof of my Daughter Eliza P. Por, her heirs and assigns, and to and for the use of such persons or persons as she shall by her last will and testament in writing duly and legally signed and witnessed ordain, nominate and appoint.

I give devise and bequeath unto John Bond and Robert H. Por All that lot on the south side of Broad Street, improved on Broad Street, with a ~~house~~ building and on Ellis Street with a wooden dwelling, bounded North by Broad Street, South by Ellis Street East by my son George's lot and West by Mr. J. Bradfords lot, To have and to hold the said lot and improvements, unto the said Robert H. and John their heirs and assigns In trust, Nevertheless and to the sole and separate use, benefit and behoof of my Daughter Mary Ann Longstreet during the term of her natural life and after her death, To and for the use and benefit of such person or persons as the said Mary Ann shall or may by her last will and testament in writing duly executed and authenticated nominate and appoint.

I also give and bequeath unto the said John Bond and Robert H. Por Eight Mares To wit, Thomas A. ... Childs, Moses and ... Willis a boy of about seven years of age, ... other children ... have and to hold the said ... and the income of the same unto the said John Bond and Robert H. Por To and for the separate use of my said daughter Mary Ann ... upon the same terms, to ... and purposes ... have and to hold the said ... and purposes ...

I give and bequeath unto the said John Brown and his heirs and assigns forever all the said Plate and Furniture and other household goods and effects which I have or shall have in my possession or control at the time of my death to be equally divided between my two Daughters, Eliza Fox and Mary Ann Longstreet, share alike, to be equally and

8th I give and bequeath all my House Hold Linen unto my two eldest Daughters Eliza Fox, Mary Ann Longstreet and Eliza Simmons to be equally divided between them share alike

9th I give and bequeath unto my two grand children Mary M. Fox William C. Fox and James C. Longstreet the shares of the Capital Stock of the Bank of Augusta to be equally divided between them share and share alike, to hold and to hold the same to them their heirs and assigns forever

10th I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Anna my part and also her Father's likeness, set in Gold together with the rest of my Jewellery not otherwise disposed of, to her and her heirs forever

11th I give and bequeath unto my son George the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars consisting of Coffee Pot, Cream Pot, Soup Bowl, Sugar dish, four large Spoons and six dessert Spoons

12th I give and bequeath my two Burs in the Presbyterian Church my undivided interest in Land lying in Barnwell and South Carolina and all other property and valuable effects, real or personal, which I am possessed of or have in my possession, unto my five children to be equally and share alike, provided however that the shares or portions which may on death fall under this clause of my Will fall to the lots of my three Married Daughters respectively Mrs Eliza Fox Mary Ann Longstreet and Ellen Stitz Simmons, I give and bequeath unto John Brown in Trust that he will hold the same the sole and separate use of my said Daughters respectively their heirs and assigns forever

13th I hereby appoint my Trusty George Paul Hudson John Brown and Robert H. Fox executors of this my last will and Testament to each of Whom I give and bequeath the sum of One hundred dollars as a compensation, but as a gift of my friendship and regard for them, In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the fourth day of May in the year of our Lord 1832
