I Mary A. Crafton of the State and County aforesaid, being in good health and sound mind, but knowing that death is certain - Do make this my last will and request.

It is my wish and desire that my dearly beloved Husband Bennett Crafton should have the whole control and management of my Estate both Real and Personal that I now have in possession, or what I will be entitled to, at the death of my Father, or that I may here in any other way, and for him to give the property, at his discretion, to my children, if I should leave any child or children, and to Elizabeth T. Crafton and Samuel Bennett Crafton the children of Maria A. Crafton. Should either of the children die, before they become of age or marry, then the surviving child or children to heir the property of the deceased child or children. In case all the children should die, before they become of age or marry, I wish my beloved Husband Bennett Crafton to heir the whole of my Estate both Real and Personal, that I now have in possession, or what I will be entitled to, at the death of my Father, or that I may here in any other way; but not to be subject to any debt contracted by my beloved Husband Bennett Crafton, previous to my marriage to him.
