

and the boys under eighteen years of age to be educated out of the income of my estate as they will allow. In the event of my death I desire that the income of my estate be first expended to their support and in case of a deficiency to educate all the children under twenty years of age. The last stated sum to be applied in educating the younger children in preference to the older children. Should my youngest child die before he or she attains the age of twenty and there should be at that time no surviving child under that age then (my wife being dead or married) the division mentioned in the second clause of this Will may take place immediately.

I appoint my wife Mary Ann Longstreet, my brother Augustus Longstreet and my son Mellicams Longstreet executor of this my last Will and testament. In testimony of all which I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this fourth of March 1830 in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and thirty.

of my estate (except the negro man above named) for the purpose of
educating my said grand son, or dividing the same among them.

of our Lord eight hundred & twenty nine.
