

In the name of God Amen. I Mary Moore widow of the
late Joseph Moore, Richmond county in the State of Georgia being weak in body, but
of sound and sound memory, do make my last will and testament in manner
and following. First, I recommend my soul to God through the merits of
our dear Jesus Christ, and my body to be decently buried, at the discretion of
my friends and executors hereafter named. And touching what worldly substance
I with pleasant soul to give me, I leave as follows, viz:

Firstly, it is my will that my dear son James Moore shall have a
share of three named John, and a certain boy Billy, said negro boy to be
bought by the executor and caretaker for the use of the said James until he is
of age, then said negro with the hire to be given up to him and
the said boy Billy.

Secondly, I leave to my dear daughter Susannah, a Feather bed and furniture

Thirdly, it is my will that the whole of the residue of my property be sold
and the proceeds equally amongst the whole of my heirs, viz, Sarah, Mary,
John, and James. And lastly, I nominate and appoint John
Moore, one of the said Sarah, caretaker, and Dolly Moore, executrix to
execute my last will and testament, and do revoke all former wills by me made,
and I declare this to be my last will and testament. In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal, the twenty eighth day of January, in the year
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty two.

At a court of ordinary held in and for the county of Richmond the 12th day of April 1868.

The within last will and testament of Mary Moore, late of the county of Richmond deceased, was presented in court, and Jane McCreary, one of the witnesses thereto subscribed, being sworn on the holy evangelists of Almighty God, made oath that she was personally present and did see the said testament signed, sealed, published, pronounced and declare the same to be and contain her last will and testament, that she was of sound disposing mind and memory according to the best of her knowledge and belief, and that she together with Robert McCreary subscribed their names as witnesses to the same at the request and in the presence of the said testatrix and in the presence of each other. ————— Whereupon it was ordered to be recorded.

At the same time Dolly Moore, named as executrix qualified as such:

In the name of God Amen. I Garland Incead of the State of Georgia, Richmond county and city of Augusta, being very sick and weak in body, but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be given unto God: Calling unto mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die; do make and ordain my last will and testament, that is to say: Principally and first of all, I give and commend my soul into the hand of Almighty God that gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent christian burial, at the discretion of my executors, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection, I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God. And as touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with in this life, I give, devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form: First, I give and bequeath to Agnes my dearly beloved wife, one third part of all the real and personal property I am possessed of, after my funeral expenses and all my just debts is paid; and also I give and bequeath to my well beloved son John Clahan; and the child that my dearly beloved wife is now big with, be it son or daughter, the other two thirds of all my estate, as before mentioned, after my funeral expense and all just debts is paid; and further it is my will, that if either of the children above mentioned should die before they are of age or unmarried, that their part shall be equally divided between my beloved wife and the surviving child; and if both should die under age or unmarried, then the whole of their parts to return to my beloved wife, if she survived them; and if she should die unmarried then her part to go to the surviving children; and also I do order, and it is my will that the parts falling to my children should be and remain in the hands of my beloved wife, during her widowhood, and after her marriage to be taken into the hands of my executors to be kept for the use of my children. And lastly, I do constitute, appoint and ordain my true and trusty friends, William Dell, Senr, John Incead, Nathaniel Incead, and William H. Dell, Junr, my executors of this my last will and testament; and I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke and disannul all and every other former testaments, wills, legacies, bequests and executors by me in any way before named, willed and bequeathed, ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty eight day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and two.
