State and County aforesaid, do make and declare this to be
my last Will and Testament.

First, After the payment of my debts and funeral expenses,
I give my whole estate both real and personal and all the
property claims and demands which I may have or possess
at my death to my Trustees hereafter named, to have and to
hold the same to the sole and separate use benefit & behoof of
my daughter Anna Frances Eliza Huxton wife of Augustus
Huxton for and during her life, and after her death to such
child or children as she may have living at her death But
in the event of her dying without leaving child or children
living at her death, then it is my will and desire that
my said daughter be at liberty, and she is hereby empow
ered to dispose of the property before mentioned either by deed or
will as she may think proper except the articles mentioned in
the next clause of this will.

Secondly, At the death of my daughter I give and bequest
to Frances Gracie Ford daughter of Gabriel C. Ford of Mon
rovia's Newberry, to her heirs forever a silver sur
face clock, a new red Turkey and blue bowl, incense with
my initials.

Thirdly, I bequest my daughter Anna Frances Eliza Huxton
the right of disposing of the property given to
her in the first clause of this will.
