

State of Georgia, Richmond County, ³ February 17th 1826

I Nancy Lumpkin of the State and County aforesaid being
sound and disposing mind memory and understanding and at the same
time considering the uncertainty of this life determined to make my last Will
and Testament and my Will and desire is after paying all my just debts
and funeral expences; I give devise & bequeath to my son Jacob Bugg one
Plantation or Tract of Land known as the former residence of Jacob Bugg Sr and
containing fifty four Acres more or less lying and being in the County
and State aforesaid and joining Land of E Bugg & Anderson Washers: So
that the said Jacob Bugg his heirs and assigns the said tract of land forever
I give and bequeath to my Daughter Obedience Bugg a negro woman
named Hannah to her & her Executors Administrators and assigns forever
I give and bequeath to my son E Bugg and E Bugg as trustee for Anne
B and my two Daughters Sarah Lark and Mary Bugg three negroes
named Abby, Betty & Simon to be equally divided by sale or otherwise as
they may think proper to them their Executors Administrators and assigns
I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Frances Ann Bugg and
her Child named Richard to her & her Executors Administrators and
assigns forever.

I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Mary Elizabeth Bugg
a negro child named Katy to her & her Executors Administrators and
assigns forever. My stock of every description & my household

Signed, sealed and declared by the Patriotic as and for her
and statement, in her presence and in the presence of each other
circumstances and bound as witnesses.
