

and remain in the power of my said son, or his assigns, to sell, convey, or otherwise dispose of the same, at his pleasure, and the proceeds of the sale of the same, or any part thereof, to be paid to my said son, or his assigns, for the use of my said son, or his assigns, in the whole, or any part of his business, or otherwise, as he shall see fit, if from any circumstance, or otherwise, he shall be in possession of my said property, or any part thereof, at the time of my death, or at any time thereafter, until he shall have disposed of the same, or any part thereof, in the manner and for the purposes hereinbefore expressed, except on the ground of his being a bankrupt, when all the property given to him shall be subject to the order of the court in his bankruptcy.

And, All debts which may be owing to me, and all claims which may be entitled from any unsettled claims, I wish should be paid as may be, and appropriated to the payment of my just debts, and the surplus, should any remain, I give my Children and before named to be equally divided between them.

And, I appoint my Brother General to be the Clerk Executor of my last will and Testament and Guardian of my Children, and in the discretion I confidently leave the direction of their education and the management of the property given for their support.

It is my will that should my sons Joseph and John both be living at my death, and during the lifetime of my Daughter Elizabeth, the property given to them, be vested in and become the property of my Daughter Elizabeth to whom in such event I then give all the property, and the testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand this 25th day of August 1845.
