I, Philip Crenshaw of the City of Augusta in
State and County, being of Sound mind & memory
make this to be My last Will and Testament
in manner & form following, to wit,

First I desire that all my Just debts shall be first paid
Secondly I give and bequeath to My Wife Elizabeth Crenshaw
during her life the House and Lot whereon I now
reside, between Broad & Ellis Streets in the City of
Augusta, Bounded on the East by William H. Jones's
lot, and on the west by William B. Frazer's lot, also
all my Household & Kitchen Furniture, and the
following Negro slaves, with the increase of them
to wit. My Negro Man named Billy, usually known as
Billy Hoker, My Negro Women Henry & Hannah, & Hannah's
female child Pervelia Ann, and at the Death of My said
Wife the House and Lot Negroes & Household & Kitchen
Furniture aforesaid, are to be divided between my
Children share and share alike, to them and their
Heirs forever.

Thirdly I give and bequeath to My son Archibald, the sum
of one Thousand Dollars, in consequence of his affliction,
and to My son Philip, and, My two Daughters, Elizabeth
Ann, and Virginia Ann, the sum of four hundred
Dollars each, to be loaned out at interest or invested
in some safe property, for their support and education.

Fourthly I give and bequeath to My Wifes sister, Harriet Boulton
who is insane, sixty Dollars annually during her life, for her
support & maintenance, to be paid by my Executors to the
person or persons who from time to time may have charge
of her.

Fifthly All the rest and residue of My Estate, I give and
bequeath to My wife and My Children share and share
alike to them and their Heirs forever.

Sixthly When My Executors are of the opinion that the value
of My Estate demands it is My Will, that without the
necessity of an order of Court, they sell publicly or
privately My Estate and invest the proceeds
in such manner as they shall think proper.

and on the west by William B. Briggs
all My Household & Kitchen Furniture, and
following Negro slaves, with the increase of

Furniture aforesaid, are to be divided between My
Children share and share alike, to them and
their heirs forever.

Thirdly I give and bequeath to My son Archibald, the sum
of one Thousand Dollars, in consequence of his office
and to My son Philip, and My two Daughters, Eliza
Ann, and Virginia Ann, the sum of four hundred
Dollars each, to be loaned out at interest or invested
in some safe property, for their support and education.

Fourthly I give and bequeath to My Wife's Sister, Harriet
who is insane, sixty Dollars annually during her life,
for support & maintenance, to be paid by My Executors or
person or persons who from time to time may have charge
of her.

Fifthly All the rest and residue of My Estate, I give and
bequeath to My Wife and My Children share and
share alike to them and their heirs forever.

Sixthly When My Executors are of the opinion that the
affairs of My Estate demands it is My Will, that without the
necessity of an order of Court, they sell publicly or
privately any part of My Estate and invest the proceeds
in such property as they may deem of most advantage
to My Estate.

I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint
My Wife, and My Brother Samuel
and My Friend John
of Augusta Executors of this My
Last Will and Testament. I also appoint
My Son Archibald.
