This is my last Will, I the subscriber Louis Blumchans born in the Parish of Grandchamp Diocese of Tarente in the formerly province of Brignolard and of age twenty two years, at present residing in the City of Augusta

First give and bequeath unto My Wife Marie Anne Gignault Myself all My real and personal property in this County, in Europe and elsewhere to have and to hold said property during her natural life.

And give and bequeath after the death of My Wife all the property and estate as that may exist at her decease to My Daughter Mary Blumchans to have & dispose of said property as she will with the privilege of selling if agreeable, therefore said property to her proper use.

And wishing that my said Daughter should marry and that she should have whatever then it is my wish and will that what of My property she then possessed of at her death may be shared between her and three of my late son John Julien, which died in Carolina and his three sons, Louis Bisson and John Julien Bisson, my nephew and the Carolina,

And in all other words that I may have made.
