2^d His my will and desire that my debts if any and my funeral expenses be paid. After which 3^d I give and bequeath to my beloved sister Rebecca Walker all my estate both real and personal whether it consists of lands or tenements goods or chattels rights or credits to her and her heirs forever.

I do constitute, ordain and appoint my beloved brother Benjamin G. Walker my
Executor of this my last will and testament hereby annulling cancelling and
declaring void all other will or wills heretofore made and published and declaring
this to be my last will and testament.

I Daniel Bowers of Beek Island Edgefield District South Carolina being of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament hereby revoking all others. After the payment of all my just debts my will and desire is that the remainder of my property be divided in the following manner.
I provide my wife ^{Martha} shall not make a claim on my estate for dower in my lands or any thing more than is herein bequeathed to her, I give and bequeath to her the following property for her use. Three negro men ^{two} ~~one~~ Dick and one negro woman named Charlotte one of my best horses and six cows & calves and annually during her natural life one third of the annual Rent of my Beek Island & Georgia plantations the rate of rent of the said plantations to be fixed by the valuation of three or four disinterested competent persons the first named of those plantations lies in this District and is known as River land is known as Ten miles bar the other lying in Richmond County Georgia and known as Bellmont also during her natural life the use of my negro man John boy Sam and my girl Jenny (bought from my Brother Philmon Bowers and named by Mary mother the children she now has) the man John to revert at the death of my wife Martha to my son James the boy Sam and girl Jenny and increase if any to my daughter Catherine Bowers big Mary and the increase she may have from which portion of my wife Martha to my daughter Anna wife of William Long big girl and bequeath to my wife Martha during her natural life the use of my household and kitchen furniture except two good beds bedsteads and a small mirror one of which for my son James & the other for my daughter Catherine Bowers said household & kitchen furniture to revert at the death of my wife Martha to my son James & my daughter Catherine Bowers and to be equally divided between them. I also give and bequeath to my wife Martha during her natural life the use of lot one of the tract of land on which I live including the buildings (except the stable which I now live in well appearing by reference to a plat made by Matthew Beekbatter dated 17th April 1835 and containing ninety nine acres which at her death is to revert to my daughter Catherine Bowers and my said daughter may have until she marries or dies a large of twenty acres. But if my wife Martha continues to my death I am satisfied with the my last will attempt to break it is void and I claim not my estate for it.
