personal Estate all my Cattle, Horses and Hogs also all my real Estate
the sum of three Hundred pounds Georgia currency, also it is my
will and desire that my said Wife should have the use of the same till
her improvements whereon she live, till my son Edward Randolph herein
immediately mentioned shall arrive at the age of twenty One years
after which time the same in Repair -
I give and bequeath to my dearly beloved son Edward Randolph all my
Wife named Peter, Also the house and Lot whereon she live with all the improve-
ments on the same.

I give and bequeath to Richard Randolph now at the Northward (son of
Isaac Robinson) the sum of one hundred pounds Georgia currency
I give and bequeath all the residue of my Estate Real and Personal to be
Equally divided between my said son Edward Randolph and my Daugh-
ter Mary Randolph and a child my said wife appears to be with
her if the said child should not come into the world alive, or if said
Mary Randolph or Edward Randolph should die it is my will that
the proportion or proportions left as above should be Equally divided between
the survivors.

I do nominate and Appoint my Dearest beloved Wife Mary Randolph
Executor of this my last will and Testament, Samuel Smith Esq. Esq. Esq.
Witness of this my last will and Testament, hereby Revoking all
wills by me heretofore made in Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal at Augusta aforesaid this Sixth Day of Nov. 1775
in the presence of one Lord One Hundred and twenty Eight
