Hobby Esquire of the City of Augusta And for divers other good causes and considerations me thereto moving have given, granted, and confirmed and these presents do give and grant and confirm unto the said John and Banna McShinn of the City of Augusta aforesaid one Negro woman named Leah aged twenty four years or thereabouts To have and to hold the said Leah and her Sons Tom and Robert aged years or thereabouts and her Muttalke Son Robert aged years or thereabouts; To have and to hold the said Leah, Tom and the said Muttalke Robert, together with all their families encrease and issue, if any, of the said Leah unto the said John, John, and Banna McShinn their heirs Executors and Administrators for ever, In Trust Nevertheless unto and for the intents and purposes herein after mentioned To wit the said Negro Banna Leah and her Sons Tom and Robert to and for the sole and separate use, benefit and behoof of the said Alfred McShinn Hobby during his life time and to his

lawfully begotten descendants of any should hereafter be
 But in the event of his dying without lawful issue born
 in wedlock then the property aforesaid that is to say
 the said Negro Woman Leah and all the future offspring
