make & publish this my last Will & Testament

Firstly, I give and bequeath to my sister Elizabeth Campbell's chil-
dren, viz. Mr. Mary Loring, John, Samuel William, Flora & Sarah
Campbell the sum of five hundred dollars each with this reservation
that the legacy bequeathed to Mr. Mary Loring be paid to John Camp-
bell as Trustee for her children the receiving the profits of said legacy
during her life and at her decease to be equally divided among
the said children.

Secondly, I give and bequeath to James Kirkpatrick five hundred
dollars.

Thirdly I give and bequeath the residue of my estate real and per-
sonal to my brothers John and Daniel Kirkpatrick for the purpose
of extinguishing all debts against me and the residue of my estate
to be received by my said brothers John & Daniel share and share
alike as their several legacies.

I do hereby constitute and appoint my said brothers John & Daniel
Kirkpatrick executors to this my last will and testament; and con-
stitute and appoint them testamentary Guardians of the minor
legacies above named and do hereby revoke all other wills by me
made.
