I Robert Lang of the City of Augusta County of the State of Georgia, being informed of body, mind and of sound and disposing memory, do hereby make and ordain this my last Will and testament that I wish

It is my will and desire that my body be interred in decent Christian burial, without any extravagant pomp or useless ceremony.

Secondly It is my wish will and desire that all my just debts be paid out of my estate, as soon as can conveniently be done by my executors after my decease.

Thirdly It is my wish will and earnest desire that after the payment of all my just debts and funeral expenses, that my wife Helena C. Lang have the possession use and enjoyment of all my estate both real and personal, and (if she shall so long remain my widow) I give and bequeath unto my said wife the possession use and full enjoyment of all my estate both real and personal money or other valuable thing, untill my eldest son, (or eldest surviving son) arrives at the age of twenty one years, to which time I wish my wife Helena C. Lang to have set apart for her sole and separate use one full third of all my estate and one third of its increase up to that time to have and enjoy the same for and during her natural life.

Fourthly It is my desire that the remaining two thirds of my estate be equally divided among my three sons William Sam and Henry, and any other child or children that I may have by my present wife Helena C. (whether born before or after my death), as they respectively arrive at the age of twenty one years, and that my wife still remain in the possession of my estate continuing to pay and deliver to my said children in equal portions their respective shares as they at they arrive at the age of twenty one years, after taking out of the said estate as above directed until the time when the said child or children shall come of age.

I do hereby certify that the above is the true and correct

It is my desire that that the share of said child be
equally shared to the survivors, and if I should be before
them, I wish by my present wife Helena E. it is my
will and intention that they shall be entitled equally
therein when living.

Lastly If my wife Helena E. Long should marry at any time
before my eldest child comes of age, it is my wish that
estate be immediately divided, allowing to my said wife
one third part of all my estate after the payment of debts
&c. as aforesaid for and during the time of her natural
life, and the remaining two thirds to be taken possession
of by my executors, and managed and increased to the
best advantage, and delivered to my said three sons
or any other children or child I may have by my wife
H. either before or after my death share and shares
as they respectively arrive at the age of twenty one year
or if she should marry at any time after my eldest
child, or eldest surviving child shall arrive at the age
twenty one, and before the whole of them shall arrive
that age, the whole of the estate then undivided to be
put into the hands of my executors and distributed as above
directed, leaving to my said wife her third as above
provided.

And it is my wish will and desire that the one third of my
estate which is given and bequeathed to my wife Helena
E. for her lifetime, at her death be equally divided among
my said children or the survivors of them, and if she
should die before my children, or any of them shall
arrive at the age of twenty one - then her said as well as the
residue of my estate, to be taken immediate possession of by my
executors and distributed equally to my children or survivors
as they respectively arrive at the age of twenty one year
And lastly I appoint Benjamin Long, William B. Long,
Nicholas (Jr.) Long, executors of this my last will and
testament, and I desire that they should have hereto set my
hand and my seal this 10th day of May just then.
