I, Robert H. Musgrove of said County and State do hereby declare and publish the present writing as a last will and testament (which bears date the eighth day of February in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and thirty) and direct that same to be annexed to and taken as a part of my said will.

Whereas it has occurred to me since the making of said will that it may become necessary to dispose of some portion of my individual property to pay off and discharge the debts of the firm of Musgrove & Bastin. Now therefore it is my will and desire that my Executors do and I hereby direct them, to sell, so soon after my decease as the interest of my Estate will permit, my plantations in Tongue's County and all the slaves and stock of what kind so ever in the same and apply the proceeds thereof to the payment of the debts of this said firm of Musgrove & Bastin. I hope will believe that this property together with the means of the said firm will be amply sufficient to discharge all their debts, but if it should not be sufficient, it is my will and desire that my Executors do and I hereby direct them, to provide for the satisfaction of all the debts of the said firm of Musgrove & Bastin as soon after my decease as practicable by the sale of such other of my individual property as they, in their discretion may consider it most for the interest of my estate to dispose of, for that purpose.

And whereas such sale of my individual property and the payment of the debts of the firm of Musgrove & Bastin with the proceeds thereof will leave my copartners and brother-in-law, Edward Bastin entitled to my estate one half of the amount so raised from my individual property and applicable to the payment of copartnership debts, it is my will and desire that my Executors will arrange with the said Edward Bastin the final payment of this debt to my estate in such manner as will, at the same time, be least inconvenient to him and most beneficial to my children who are commended specially to the care and protection
