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I Roger W Cook formerly of the Town and County of Litchfield and State of Massachusetts do hereby certify that the undersigned last past an inhabitant of Edgewood in the State of Georgia, and at the time of his death, being in full health, but of sound and disposing mind and memory, did make, execute, ratify and confirm his last will and Testament to wit

I give devise and bequeath to my brother David Cook of the County of Wilkes and State of Georgia and his heirs and assigns forever, the Part which I own in the land of the County of Wilkes and State of Georgia and also my black man or servant called

the will of my said Brother David -
 I give and bequeath to my said Brother David, and to my wife Maria Cook, both of the County of
 Fairfield and State of Connecticut, all such debt, whether incurred before, during or after my decease,
 owing to me, at the time I entered into Copartnership with William I. Cooke of said County of
 Fairfield, shall remain unpaid at the time of my decease, to be equally divided between them, the said David and
 Maria, meaning and intending hereby, to give devise and bequeath to them the said David and the said
 Maria his and assigns forever, all the notes, bonds, accounts, and debts due and owing to me at the time I
 entered into the Copartnership aforesaid, and remaining unpaid at the time of my decease, to be equally
 between them, the said David and the said Maria. - I give, devise and bequeath to my father Roger Cooke
 of said Fairfield and his heirs forever, in trust and for the sole and exclusive benefit of my said sister Maria
 Cooke, all the real estate, which I own situate in the town of Hamden in the said County of Fairfield and
 State of Connecticut; and I do hereby authorize and empower my said father Roger Cooke to make sale of
 said real estate, at such time as he may deem proper, and do order and direct that he pay over the amount
 of said sale after deducting the expenses of selling the same, to my said sister Maria Cooke, to whom I give, devise and
 bequeath the said avails, to him and his heirs and assigns forever. - And as to all the real and personal of my
 said both real and personal, I hereby create and constitute the same a fund for the payment of my said
 real and personal expenses, and I do order and direct, that all the debts due from and owing by me at the time of
 my decease, and my funeral expenses shall be paid and satisfied out of the said real and personal of my
 said estate. And whatever of the residue of my estate shall remain (if any there be) after the payment of my
 said real and personal expenses, I give, devise and bequeath the whole thereof both real and personal to my
 said brother David Cooke and my said sister Maria Cooke and their heirs and assigns forever to be equally
 divided between them - I constitute and appoint my said brother David Cooke, and William I. Cooke of
 said Fairfield Executors of this my last Will and Testament. And I do hereby make all wills, testaments
 and bequests by me heretofore made, and do make, publish and declare this and this only to be my last Will
 and Testament. In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal, in the City of
 Fairfield this twenty day of October A.D. 1823.

Item, I will and order that the said Sander and I now live, together with all the balance of my property, to be as convenient, and that all just debts be paid out of my estate, and the balance I give and bequeath to my beloved son George Henderson, It is my will and desire that my neighbor Thomas should purchase the lot on which I live, as he has for a long time owned all the rest of the property of which the said lot hereunto is a small part, and for that purpose that the terms be made as favorable to him as possible. Lastly, I appoint my friends Sander and Thomas Walker Executors of this my last Will and Testament, and I hereby revoke all former Wills by me made.
