 married his likewise five cows and calves five yearlings his choice of  
 the stock one Dutch oven one Polish Horse known by the name of black saddle  
 and bridle likewise the half of the profits arising from the plantation of  
 more Lincoln during her widowhood and then to return to my son William  
 and the remainder of the stock Horses Cows and pigs to be sold and the  
 money arising from such stocks to be put to Interest for the support of  
 my two children William and Ann likewise my notes and bonds to be  
 put to the same use and when they come to the years of majority the money  
 to be equally divided my wife and all my children and grand child  
 even to have an equal part after all my Just debts is paid I bequeath  
 to my beloved Isaac Low five pounds ster and fifty Acres of Land known  
 by the name of the meadow Ground I bequeath unto my beloved daughter  
 Ester Hart one Chest of drawers I bequeath to Bruce Hickenbottom ten  
 shillings sterling I bequeath unto my beloved son George Low two  
 hundred and fifty Acres of Land known by the name of Hart's Land likewise  
 one Negro boy named Naffey one feather bed I bequeath to my beloved  
 son William Low the plantation I now live on likewise all the land  
 lying in plantation belonging to me and all the working tools and  
 plow I bequeath to my beloved daughter Ann one silver hair combed  
 David and when David pays twenty pounds into the hands of my  
 Executors for the use of id Ann then id David to be free I bequeath  
 to my beloved Grand daughter Grace Hickenbottom one feather bed  
 I nominate and appoint my dearest friend Abraham Johnston  
 and George Low Executors of this my last will and Testament as  
 witness my hand and seal this fourth day of January In the year of  
 our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Ninety
