I Sarah Drury of the above place being myself very weak in body although as sound in mind as usual, and willing in view of my death that whatever property I possess at that time might be disposed to Doctor Elisha DeBussy of Baltimore, in consequence of the kindness and affection which he has always exhibited towards me and towards his other relations. I do therefore make this my last Will and Testament, that is to say. I do hereby bequeath to the above mentioned Doctor Elisha DeBussy of Baltimore the whole of whatever property or effects of what nature or kind so ever I may be possessed of at the time of my death, for the payment of all my Debts and funeral expences, and for expending the sum of \$1000.00 in such manner as he may think proper.
