I Sarah Hull of the County of Baker, State of Georgia, being of sound and disposing mind and full of years, and well in body and calling to mind the uncertainty of life, do hereby declare to dispose of all such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with. Do make and declare this my last will in manner following That is to say, I desire that of all of my personal Estate of Corn, and Cotton, be immediately sold after my decease, and out of the money arising therefrom all my just debts, and funeral expenses, be paid. And should the above named Crop of Corn and Cotton prove insufficient for the above purpose, then I desire that my executors, hereafter named, out of the money arising from the sale of the same, due me pay, and satisfy such of my just debts, as shall remain unpaid out of the sale of my present Crop of Corn and Cotton, after payment of my just debts and funeral expenses. I give to my Grand Daughters Mary Ann Hull, Louisa Hull, M. Frances Hull, all of that tract or parcel of Land known by the name of the Hollowman Place or Plantation, lying in Baker County, State of Georgia, also my negro man named Ben Oakes of my flock of Sheep my lot of Oxen &c. &c. my black Mule called Red and all of my flock of Hogs, all of which property both real and personal, as above named, I give to my grand Daughters as above named to them and their Heirs forever, to be equally divided among them at the decease of their father my Son Thomas H. Hull, whom I do constitute, and appoint Guardian, for the above named Mary Ann Hull, Louisa Hull, M. Frances Hull, and the above named Thomas H. Hull Guardian, shall have, full Control and management of the above named property, both real and personal during his natural life for the use and benefit of the above named Mary Ann Hull, Louisa Hull, and M. Frances Hull, I give and be equally, to my Grand Daughters Eliza Ann Hull and Sarah Jane Hull, all of that tract or parcel of Land on which is my Mansion House, Also another tract or Lot of Land adjoining the other, both of which two tracts contain five hundred acres, more or less, lying in Baker County, State of Georgia, also I give to the said Eliza Ann Hull, and Sarah Jane Hull the following personal property viz My negro man named Bid, Goat of D. Man, Little Horse, &c. &c.

and all of my flock of Hogs, all of which property both real and
personal, as above named, I give to my grand Daughters as above
named to them and their heirs forever, to be equally divided among
them at the decease of their father my son Thomas H. Hull, whom
I do constitute, and appoint Guardian, for the above named
Mary Ann Hull, Louisa Hull, M. Anne Hull, and the
above named Thomas H. Hull Guardian, shall have full control
and management of the above named property, both real and
personal during his natural life for the use and benefit of
the above named Mary Ann Hull Louisa Hull, and M. Anne
Hull, I give and bequeath, to my Grand Daughters Eliza Ann
Hull and Sarah Jane Hull, all of that tract or parcel of Land
on which is my Mansion House, Also another tract or lot of
Land adjoining the other, both of which together contain five,
hundred acres, more or less, lying in Baker County, State
of Georgia, Also, I give to the said Eliza Ann Hull, and Sarah
Jane Hull the following personal property viz My negro Man
named, Big George, D. Mary, Little George, Manda, Willy,
Henry, Sam, Marinda, Walter, Sam, and Sally, all
one half Dozen, Silver Table Spoon, one dozen and seven Silver
Tea Spoon, One pair of Silver Sugar tongs, One Glass Sugar
dish, Silver pitcher, beds, and all of my bed clothes, and
two bedsteads, all of which property, both real and personal
as above named I give to them, their heirs, executors,
administrators and assigns forever to be equally divided between
the said Eliza Ann Hull, and Sarah Jane Hull, whom I

Said Sarah I and Hull shall arrive at the age of eighteen years or either of them is married, All the rest of my estate both real and personal of what nature or quality I may be, not having particularly disposed of, I desire may be immediately sold after my decease and the money arising therefrom to be equally divided, between my two Grand Daughters, Eliza Ann Hull, and Sarah Jane Hull, as before mentioned, when the Said Sarah I and Hull shall arrive at the age of eighteen years, or either of them is married,
And I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends Richard M. Wether, William Robt. and Charles Dupont, Executors of this my Last will and Testament,
