In the name of God amen, I Benjamin H Lyon of the City
of Augusta and State of Georgia, being of Sound and
Disposing mind and memory, but possessing a feeble & infirm
Constitution and Recollecting the Extremity uncertainly of Life
do make and declare the following to be my last will and
Testament hereby revoking all others heretofore made
Firstly I desire that all my just debts be paid
Secondly I desire that the proceeds arising from the hire of
My three Negro men to wit Dick, Jim, and Caesar be paid
annually by my Executor Equally between My two Sisters Mrs M
C Roberts of the State of South Carolina Bannell District and
Mrs Elizabeth M Hobbs of the City of Augusta during their
Separate lives, and I hereby appoint William R M Saunders Trustee
for My said natural Sister Mrs J P Roberts
Thirdly I desire that the rent of My Store house upon Bay
Street, and My interest in the Family groceries and Bar also my
Execution in the hands of the Sheriff against William L Hobbs
for \$1000, the same having been transferred to me by the Plaintiff
My Wife & I together for a valuable Consideration and the
Lots of Land Two Lying in Charlestown and the other in
Countryside to be appropriated by My Executor to the improvement
of My Estate
