Impressus I give to my Executors Hereinafter named, full power and Authority, without any order from any Court, to sell and dispose of all my Estate, both real and personal, at their discretion, and from the fund so raised, my Will and desire is, that all my Just debts, and Funeral Expenses, be first paid.

Item I give and bequeath to the persons named as my said Executors, the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars, in trust for the support and education of my Son Charles Harris Parmelee, until he arrive at the age of Twenty one Years, when said Legacy shall be paid over to him, to be absolutely and forever his own.

Item To my Mother, Mrs. Lucy Parmelee of Litchfield Connecticut, I give and bequeath the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars, the income of which she is to enjoy, absolutely, during her natural life: and on her Death, said Sum of Ten Thousand Dollars is to be divided equally, between my sisters, Caroline and Celeste Parmelee: or should either of them die, before and Mother, to the Survivor of the two, I give the whole forever.

Item To my Brother in-law, John A. Cleveland of Charleston, I give and bequeath the sum of Three Thousand Dollars, in trust, that he apply the income thereof to the support of his sisters, Harriett Williard, Rebecca W. Cleveland, and Charlotte H. Cleveland, during their lives, and the life of any one of them: the principal of said fund ultimately to belong to the Survivor of said Sisters, or, should said John A. Cleveland survive them all, to him, absolutely and forever.

Item I give and bequeath to the said John A. Cleveland the sum of one thousand Dollars, to be used for the use of the

Cleveland, and Charlotte H. Cleveland, during their lives, and the life of any one of them: the principal of said fund ultimately to belong to the Survivor of said sisters, or, should said John A. Cleveland survive them all, to him, absolutely and forever.

I give and bequeath to the said John A. Cleveland the sum of One Thousand Dollars, in trust for the use of the four Children of said Harriett Williard, now leaving the principal and interest thereof to be applied to their support and education, at the discretion of said John A. Cleveland.

To My Maternal uncle, Urias Lewis of Litchfield, Connecticut I give and bequeath the sum of fifteen hundred Dollars.

To my beloved wife, Mary E. Parmelee, I give and bequeath all the rest and residue of my Estate, of any kind and description whatever, in full satisfaction of all Claims.
