County of Richmond, being of my Sane, full
perfect mind and Memory, Thanks be to God, Calling
to mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it
is appointed for all people one to die, do make
and Ordain this my last Will and Testament, That is
to say principally and first of all I give and recom-
mend my Soul into the hands of Allmighty God,
that graciously receive my Soul, and my body I recommend to the earth
to be buried in decent Christian manner at the
discretion of my friends, nothing doubting but at
the general resurrection I shall receive the same
again by the mighty power of God, and all
my worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased
God to bless me with, in this life I give, devise
and dispose of to my loving Sister Frances Webster
first of all I give to her all my rights of all Lands
three Cows and Calves, also all my Cloathing, one good
ring, one bed and furniture, and all my house
furniture, also all the debts that is due to me
Satisfying this to be my last Will and Testament
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and seal this twenty sixth day of February in the
year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and
Ninety two and in the seventeenth year of the
reign of America
