Ultimate I wish to have use & enjoy her own time af-
ter she shall have paid the sum of one hundred dollars to my
estate & I hereby charge my Executors or Administrators with her
protection

3^d To my brother Phyzickah I give a suit of clothes to be paid
for out of my estate to the value of forty dollars.

4th The residue of my property shall be charged with the sup-
port of my father & mother as long as they live.

5th After the death of my father & mother, I wish all my estate
real, personal & otherwise to be divided equally in four parts be-
tween my four sisters Elizabeth Bailey, Sarah Bailey, Lucy Bailey,
& Corda Bailey & my niece Nancy Ann Ray, for their sole & spe-
cial use & property, so that their husbands shall have no control or
legal interest in the same; & provided my niece Nancy Ann Ray
shall die before she shall be married, & have issue, or before she comes
of age, I then desire her portion of my property to be equally divided
between my four sisters in proportion & form & under some conditions
& limitations as before mentioned

6th I do hereby appoint W. D. Butler & A. J. Huntington of the City
of Augusta Executors of this my last Will & Testament.

Anderson of the City of Augusta, Richmond County & State of Georgia, considering the uncertainty of this mortal life & being of sound mind, memory & understanding, blessed be Almighty God for the same, do make & publish this my last will & Testament, in manner as follows.

1st I give & bequeath to my beloved wife, Ann B. Anderson Eight thousand dollars, after which the following amounts or a proportion of the same, agreeably to the amount of property left as hereafter mentioned, vizt. I give & bequeath to my sister Amanda Thomsen, four hundred dollars, to be placed in the hands of some trusty person for her use & I also give & bequeath to my sister in Law Martha B. Miller four hundred dollars. I also give & bequeath to my sister in Law Jane B. Hennick, the following described property, vizt. one negro woman named Rose & her three children Thomas, William & a young child, also four hundred dollars in cash, together with my gold pocket watch, ornaments &c. I also give & bequeath to my son Lewis Hennick one thousand dollars. I also give & bequeath to my ——— six hundred dollars payable in one year after my death. I also give & bequeath to my son Anderson, one hundred & fifty dollars, all the same to be paid
