of the uncertainty of life at all times do make and ordain this my
last Will and Testament for the disposition of all my worldly ef-
fects in the manner following to wit:
Item the first. It is my will that my Executor shall make and
sell my Estate both real and personal and collect the debts due
me and pay all my just debts out of the proceeds.
Item the second. It is my will and desire that the residue of
the proceeds of my Estate shall be divided equally between my wife
and children to each an equal share.
Item the third. It is my will that my childrens money shall be
put to interest and such portions as is necessary to educate and
support them be repaid to that purpose.
For the purpose of carrying this my Will into effect I appoint my
friend Edward M. Collins my sole Executor. In testimony whereof
