Do hereby make this my Last Will and Testament
By these presents revoking all others,

Item First.

I Request and desire my Executors and Trustees
hereinafter mentioned, to carry my wishes in full
as far as they are able

Item Second.

I enjoin that all my just Debts be paid to effect
this most Desirable object. I wish that the property
I now hold shall be kept together until they are paid
Always allowing a sufficient Stipend for myself
and family, for their decent Support

Item Third.

After my Debts are paid I desire that my property
shall still continue together until my oldest surviving
child shall attain his or her Majority. On the day
child attaining this or her Majority. I Order my Executors
and Trustees shall and will deliver unto him or
her child part of the Negro Slaves, and at child's part
all the Land "Save and Except the Home tract
Containing Some 1880 hundred acres on which I
now reside" and to each of my other children on
attaining their majority, each at child's part my Dear wife
to count as a child

Item Fourth.

Unto my Dear Beloved wife Anna C. Bullock I give
the One of my children The Land on which I now
reside, all my Goods and chattels viz. Horses, M.
Cows & Calves, Woods, other Stock, Sheep, Cattle, Plantation
Tools, Crop on Hand, Household and Kitchen furniture
and all Description of Perishable Property. I now
with the use of my Slaves for the purpose before
named, and for the bringing up of my children

Item Fourth. On the last child coming of age I leave unto
Dear wife, a child's part of my Negro Slaves and
other Land in all respects as a child of mine

Item Fifth.

Unto my Son John I give a Good Cott about a quarter
of a mile from the Town

the most Desirable Object. I wish that the property I now hold shall be kept together until they are all
allowing of a sufficient stipend to support
and furnish, for their decent Support

Item Second. After my debts are paid I desire that my property shall still continue together until my oldest surviving child shall attain his or her majority. On the 9th Child attaining his or her majority I desire my law and Executor shall and will deliver unto him or her at child's part of the negro slaves, and at child's part, all the Land "Save and Except the Home tract containing some 1880 hundred acres on which I now reside" and to each of my other children attaining their majority, each a child's part my dear wife to count as a child.

Item Third. Unto my dearly beloved wife Ann C. Bulcher I give the care of my children the land on which I now reside, all my Goods and Chattels viz. Horses, Mares, Cows & Calves, Woods, other Stock, Sheep, Cows, Plaster Tools, Croppon Hand, Household and Kitchen furniture and all Description of Portable Property. I now sell with the care of my slaves for the purpose before named, and for the better bringing up of my children.

Item Fourth. On the last child coming of age I leave unto dear wife, a child's part of my negro slaves and other land in all respects as a child of mine.

Item Fifth. Unto my Son Tom I give a Gorzel Colt about as you old know as Tom.

Item Sixth. I hereby constitute, and appoint, my Dearest Beloved wife Ann C. Bulcher my Executor, and having full power and ability I do constitute my Brother John C. Bulcher of Burke County, my whom failing my brother named John of Richmond County, to be and always remain, my Executor.

Item Seventh. I declare all however to receive, after and to be done with this my last will and testam-

In Witness whereof I have this my nineteenth day of December One Thousand Eight hundred and forty five year. Signed my name, and affixed my Seal in presence of James L. Fullcher, Valentine Fullcher, and E. Gordon, all of the County of Richmond, of the State of Georgia.
